## World's Tallest Building

### A Credit of a Graduate of Ahsanullah Engineering College (BUET)

I was visiting the USA to see my daughter and grand children in May-July, 2015. During the visit, we made a visit to SEAR Tower, now WILLIS Tower in Chicago, Illinois, USA. I saw an Engineer's photograph and his creation, i.e. WILLIS TOWER. I was amazed to see his work and was very proud to find that he was a BUET graduate, from the same place from where I got my Engineering degree. He was a Bangladeshi origin Engineer, Dr. Fazlur Rahman Khan, in short (F R Khan). I am also very proud to see a Bangladeshi person is the creator of tubular structure design which was the basis of high rise structures. He was known as Bangladeshi Einstein.

Dr. F R Khan had designed and builds the tallest tower of the world (1971-1973). The story goes like this One day he was bringing out cigarette to smoke from a round cigarette box containing cigarettes. While toppling to bring out one stick, he notice that 3-4 sticks also came out to support the first one. He got the idea from this small incident. He started designing and the next few years; he designed and built the tallest structure in the world.

Here is summery of details :

Wills Tower contains approximately 4.56 million gross square feet and has a rentable area of 3.8 million square feet.

4.56 million Gross square feet would cover 105 acres if spread across one level, or the equivalent of 16 city block in Chicago.

Within the building, there are

- 25 miles of plumbing,
- 1,500 miles of electric wiring,
- 40 miles of elevator cable, and
- 145,000 light fixtures.



The building weights more than 222,500 tons, and it cost more than \$175 million to build.

Each floor of the building is divided into 75-foot, column-free squares, or "mega-modules," which provide maximum planning, flexibility and efficiency.

Large windows provide maximum light and views, further enhanced by the corridors created by the tower's set back on all sides.

Only the finest materials are used throughout the buildings common areas to highlight the property's prestige, such as the lobby's walls of travertine highlighted with stainless steel trim, polished granite flooring, and decorative ceiling lighting.

Year when build 1971-1973.

Main Architect : Bruce Graham.

Main Engineer : Fazlur Rahman Khan.



Dr. F R Khan - The father of tubular structure was born in Aga Mosey Lane, Dhaka on April 3, 1929 to Khan Bahadur Abdur Rahman Khan and Khadiza Khatun, The father was a mathematics teacher. He was brought up in the village of Bhandarikandi, under Shibchar Police Station of Faridpur.

Dr. Khan attended Armanitola Government High School, in Dhaka. After completing undergraduate coursework at the Bengal Engineering College, now Indian Institute of Engineering Science and Technology, Shibpur, University of Calcutta, he received his Bachelor of Civil Engineering degree from Ahsanulla Engineering College, University of Dhaka (now BUET). He received a Fulbright Scholarship and a Pakistan government scholarship, which enabled him to travel to the United States in 1952. There he studied at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. In three years Khan earned two master's degrees - one in structural engineering and one in theoretical and applied mechanics - and a PhD in structural engineering, with thesis titled Analytical study of relations among various design criteria of rectangular prestressed concrete beams.

In 1971 the Bangladesh Liberation War broke out. Dr. Khan was heavily involved with creating public opinion and garnering emergency funding for Bengali people during the 1971 Bangladesh Liberation War. He created Chicago-based organization known as Bangladesh Emergency Welfare Appeal.

Dr. Khan died of heart attack on 27 March 1982 while on a trip to Jeddah, Saudi Arabia, at the age of 52. He was the general partner in SOM, the only engineer holding that high position at the time. His body was returned to the United States and was buried in Chicago.

Dr. F R Khan was married to an Austrian Lady. Leselotte Khan (1930-1995) and had a wonderful married life for 23 years till he died. They had one daughter, Dr. Yasmin Sabina Khan (born 1960), also a structural engineer.

One of the most favorite songs of Dr. F R Khan was a Tagore song 'Tomar Holo Shure, Amar Holo Shara'.

While there is a will, there is a way.

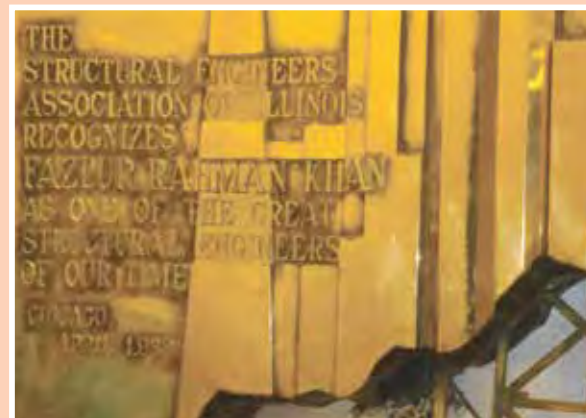
Select your goal and do not re-course.

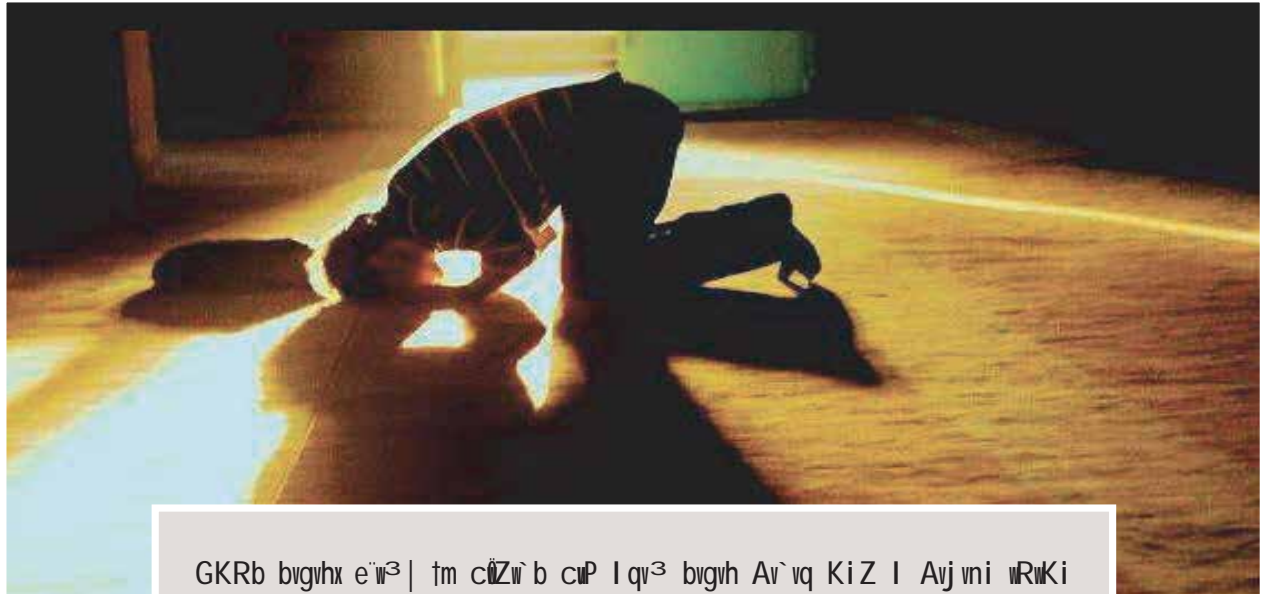

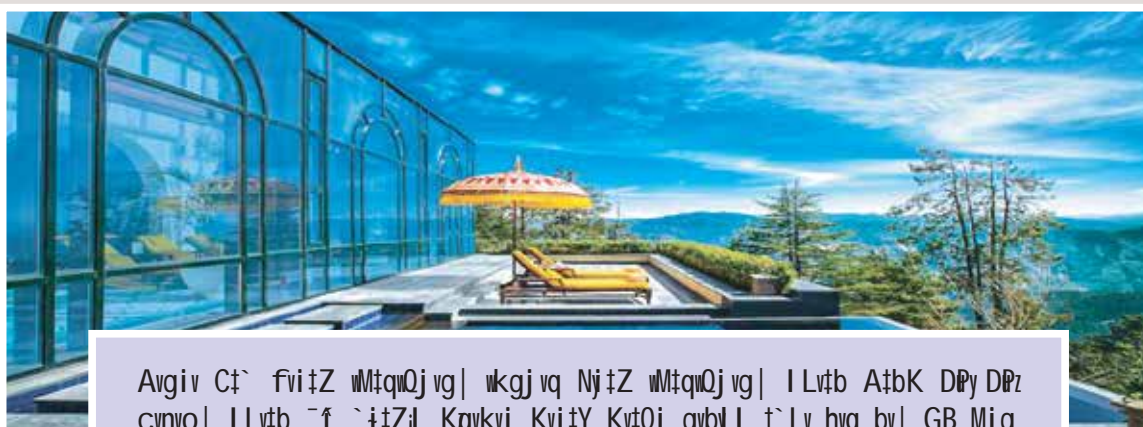

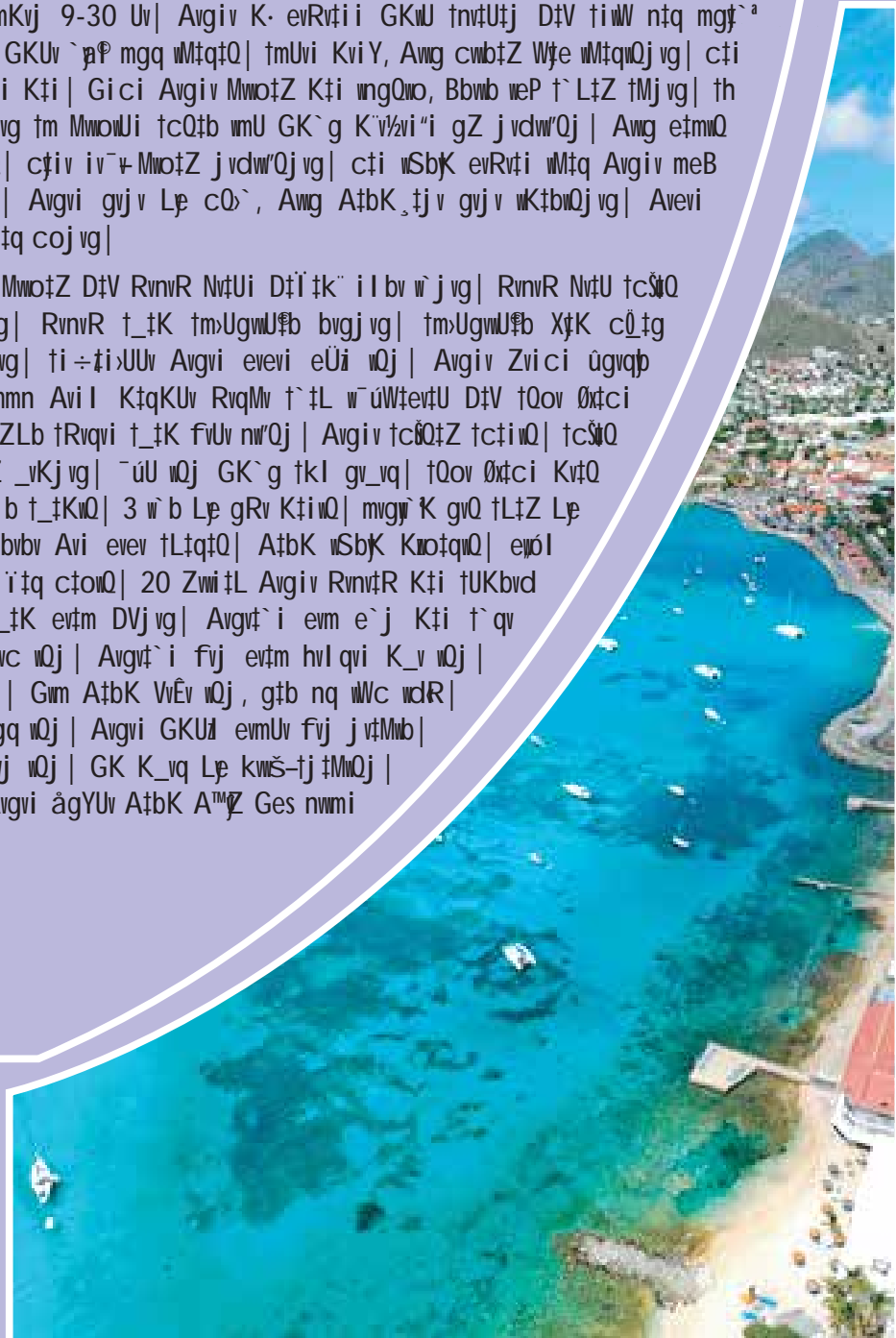

Muslims from all around the world come and visit the Prophet (sm)'s Rawza with due respect. Our Prophet was a man of best conduct and character. In matter of forgiveness, generosity, forbearance, kindness, honesty, patience, truthfulness, work and deeds, attitude, behavior, humanity and greatness he was the excellent ideal of mankind of all ages. Allah Tala says,

We should always follow our Great Prophet Hazrat Mohammad (sm)'s ideal life.

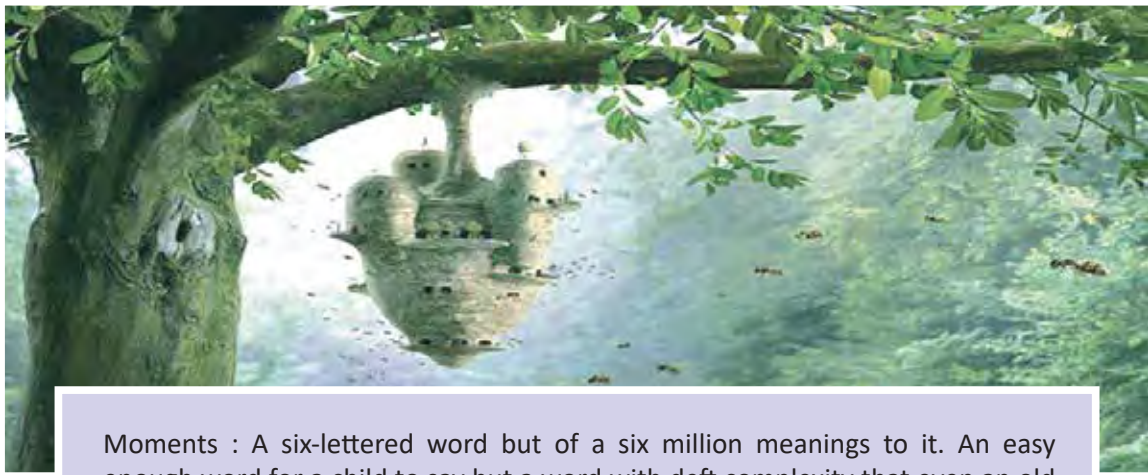
